
Ethical rules **for publishing materials in** **the International scientific conference** **„Architecture and Civil Engineering“ ArCivE**

These ethical rules for accepting and publishing material are based on the ethical standards and criteria set out in the Code of Ethics for Academic Unity of VFU "Chernorizets Hrabar" and in the Bulgarian legislation, as well as the internationally recognized ethical rules and standards, corresponding to the Charter and the Code of European Scholars.

The decision to accept or refuse to publish a proposed material is made on the basis of its scientific value, criteria for publication in the proceedings volume and in accordance with the principles of academic morality, its ethical principles and rules, and the editorial policy of the journal.

The conference does not accept materials that:

- are not in accordance with its scientific topics and publishing criteria;
- contain unacceptable and pseudoscientific theories and claims;
- express political and personal biases of the authors;
- include texts that abuse individuals and institutions or exhibit negative personal sentiments (offensive qualifications on a scientific, religious, political or personal basis).

The authors are directly responsible for the accuracy of their scientific publications and must adhere to the citation rules indicated.

It is unacceptable:

- Plagiarism in all its forms;
- Falsifying data and results in the material presented;
- Co-authoring persons who have no real input into the research and into the writing of the relevant text;
- Use of unscientific arguments;
- Deliberate omission of contributions from other authors in the field of the study;
- Publication of offensive material, as well as material that does not contain essential, new or additional reasoning
